## Sports Premium Impact Statement 2014-2015

Through the 'Sport Premium' the Government has provided £150 million over two academic years (2013-14 & 2014-15) to support the delivery of PE and sport in primary schools.

This funding is ring fenced and allocated directly to primary schools across England, providing them with funds to buy in invaluable expertise and support. Primary schools are able to determine what they believe to be the most appropriate use of this funding. Each school receives £8,000 plus an extra £5 per pupil.

At Cockton Hill Infants' School our Sport Premium allocation for **2014 – 2015** is £8,565.

We have used this money in the following ways:

Activity Leadership Apprentice	£4555	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Worked alongside class teachers supporting groups of children in curriculum PE</li> <li>Led playground activities during break and lunchtimes</li> <li>Taken small groups of Early Years children into the hall to work on basic movement skills</li> <li>Supported TAs in the delivery of specific motor skill interventions for children identified with dyspraxia</li> <li>Used these skills to support early handwriting development in our Reception classes</li> <li>Supported the delivery of after-school clubs e.g. football, cheerleading, street dance, archery.</li> </ul>
Employ a dance specialist to provide a weekly session in school working with all year groups, to enhance the PE curriculum	£1,560	<p>Support in the promotion and development of links to local sports clubs (Xtreme Dance Fusion) thus increasing the range of physical activities available to pupils during and after school.</p> <p>These sessions help to develop basic skills, co-operation and creativity.</p>
Provide Bushcraft / Survival skills training on site for Year 2. (Thrills & Skills for Life are the providers this year, June 2015)	£500	As an introduction to survival skills, all of Year 2 experience a day of team building involving building shelters and problem solving on the school field. This helps pupils to become more independent and confident whilst learning in the outdoors.
Extend extra curricular clubs involving sport/dance/archery	£1560	Funding this after school programme has had a huge impact on the pupils and has allowed many pupils to develop a more positive self image and to grow in confidence.

Pay for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport. (CPD – our PE lead Jen Laycock has masters in PE for Young Children – works with other staff in school)	£600	Develop skills and confidence in those staff who have embarked on this training and professional development.

As illustrated above, the money allocated to the above activities extends well above the Sports Premium amount. However, we believe the impact of spending extra money in this way is very worthwhile and has had huge benefits to the pupils and the school community as a whole.
